HOSPITALITY AND STREET OUTREACH PROGRAM | SEPTEMBER, 2019

The following data and information is provided to the Downtown Reno Business Improvement District for tracking purposes. The information contained in this report is for activities reported in September 2019. The data and information is obtained from Ambassadors conducting patrols and entered in Statview.







ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

This month, Ambassadors continued leadership training with John Firestone. Supervisors, Operations Manager, and Outreach Specialists were given additional training designed to ensure a more sustainable structure within the team. They learned to identify and nurture each Ambassador's strong points, and the pros and cons of transitional versus transformational leadership tactics. Since the beginning of the training, turnover rate has dropped significantly.

Twice a month the Ambassadors go speak to inmates in the county jail to connect, inform and motivate. This month, we brought well respected and endeared local journalist, Landon Miller, to teach them the value of their story and how they can use it as a springboard into a successful life.

We also bring in local agencies to educate our ambassadors. Ridge House reps were invited to share information about their program and the houses they have. Mrs. Culpepper invited Ambassadors, on their off time, to join others in the new opening of their latest remodeled Women's House.

ENGAGEMENTS:

These engagements show the Ambassador are committed to be a big part of the solution to some of the problems we have on the streets.

• The Ambassador team informed Outreach during briefing that Charles was ready to receive help. Outreach safely escorted Charles to the Seasons0 Inn on 495 West St. where operators denied him entry due to prior experience. Outreach then safely escorted Charles to the Horseshoe Motel where he was denied because of his appearance and odor. Ambassador Shannon helped Outreach find Charles a room at the Flamingo Motel for two nights. VOA supplied Ambassador Shannon with food and clothing for Charles. The team of Ambassadors will do checks periodically throughout the day while Outreach finds a sober living program.

- Ambassador Shannon came across Eric Kennedy, a 44-year-old, highly intoxicated man, at the AT&T building. Ambassador Molly and Supervisor Roderick escorted Eric to Well Care where they admitted him.
- Keith Grassi asked for help getting into detox. Instead of rushing him into a program we were able to find out through Rachel from Health Plan of Nevada (HPN) that he is already a client, and that they would get him into detox and then back to housing.
- Ambassadors spent multiple hours this week safe walking Gladys to and from the Volunteers of America shelter and base. Donald went with her from motel to motel and eventually got her a room for two weeks at the Castaway Inn.

INITIATIVES:

Outreach is facing obstacles with transitional living from motel to home for individuals who are struggling to find apartments. We find that it's not just a lack of resources, but also a lack of communication. Outreach is establishing a direct line of communication with organizations such as Living Stones, Reno Behavioral Health, Crossroads, Volunteers of America, and Little Flower Church. Also, once in housing, how can we set up a continuum of care to ensure that the individual does not cycle back on to the streets? We are looking to establish a better line of communication with CoC/wrap-around service options.

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
