STREET STORIES:

- A team of ambassadors went to Evans Park to remove the encampment that we have been working on for the last few days. Upon our arrival, they contacted nonemergency and officer Jenkins came to the park and helped the team of ambassadors remove the individuals from the park. Officer Jenkins informed us that the ambassadors have to call Volunteers of America and make sure there are beds available before we remove the camps.
- Ambassador Shantera assisted with Stan Gardener age 59 he needed her to call REMSA. He was complaining about a swollen ulcer and was in a lot of pain. Stan was taken to the hospital.
- Ambassador Deloney assisted with a person slumped over complaining of chest pain. He was located on 4th St. in front of St. Vincent. Deloney called nonemergency. Shortly after REMSA arrived and they took him to the hospital.
- Ambassador Donald observed Anna laying in the front of the National Bowling Stadium. He conducted a wellness check and noticed that she was intoxicated. She was too intoxicated to walk. He transported her in a wheelchair to Wellcare. However, they had no female beds available. Donald then called REMSA and she was taken to the hospital
- Ambassadors had to call non-emergency to 275 East 4th Street to remove a group of people drinking, causing a disturbance and refusing to leave. RPD arrived and office Wilson removed all individuals –no arrests were made.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

We look at Accomplishments this month in two different categories: Health and Social.

Several times a day ambassadors encounter downtown residents that are in failing health or a crisis situation. At times these people are either too inebriated to care for themselves or are found in a condition where calling for emergency services is not an option. Ambassadors frequently have been the bridge between a very sick downtown resident and proper health care.

Some of our social achievements have come in the process of setting the standards for social norms. How we do this is by focusing on behavior on our neighbors downtown. When Ambassadors properly influence following the rules we are also helping the population to build foundational skills that are necessary to improving lifestyle and stability.

In addition to this, one of the number one assets to having our ambassadors on the streets is that we become the eyes and ears of downtown. On April 26, Ambassadors were able to locate a female minor runaway. Ambassadors were able to keep her to a safe and secure while RPD was notified and return her to her family.

INITIATIVES:

Ambassadors are currently still providing water to the unsheltered population, and have been working with the city to provide portable pottys and hand washing stations.


